Naha-kuko Station is located in Naha Airport, the gateway to Okinawa and is the starting point for the Yui Rail service as well as the westernmost rail station in Japan. Akamine Station is Japan's southernmost rail station. The area near Oroku Station is developing as a new commercial district served by the monorail. Business hotels are increasing in number and it is becoming a new hub for tourism.

Stone markers erected to commemorate Japan's westernmost and southernmost stations

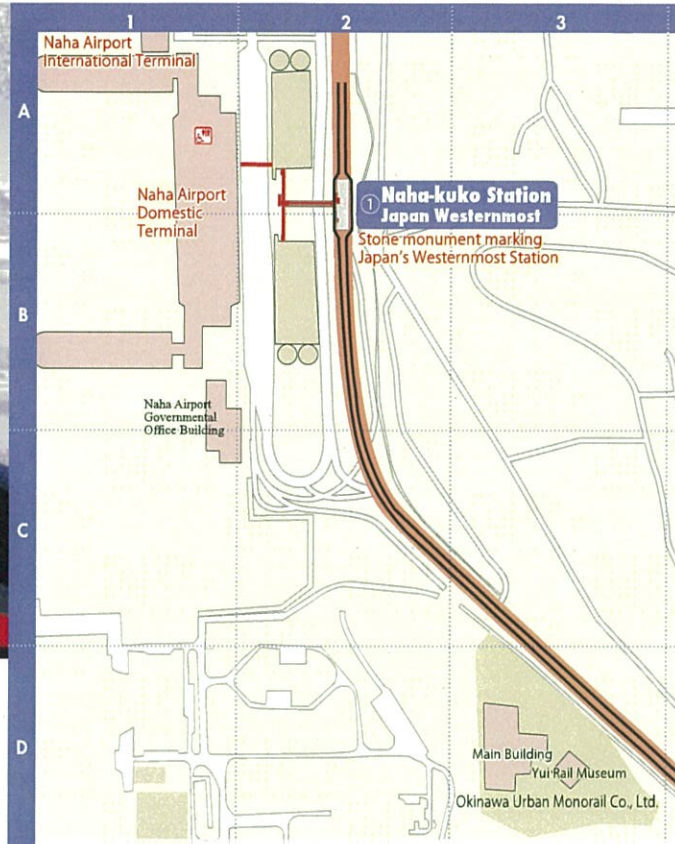


The Naha-kuko Station, which is at the westernmost and Akamine Station at the southernmost tip of Japan's transportation system traffic. A monument made from Ryukyu limestone is placed in front of the ticket gate of the Naha-kuko Station. A miniature of Japanese radish is embedded at the location, telling the story of how the land was a Japanese radish field. The stone marker at the southernmost station in Japan is placed in the traffic square of Akamine Station where photographers can commemorate the location perfectly with the station as the backdrop.

Linked directly to the airport, Yui Rail allows passengers to leave all worries of traffic behind when traveling to Kokusai Street or the Shuri district. The monorail also provides direct access to the Jusco Naha Shopping Center and DFS Galleria via connecting platforms, making last-minute shopping convenient. The airport itself houses restaurants and other shopping areas for souvenir gifts.



Okinawan and Japanese cuisine, sandwich shops, Chinese and other restaurants line this floor.



In the shopping area, stores such as Antenna Shop and Washita Shop sell Okinawan products.



There are observation decks on both ends of the building where visitors can leisurely enjoy views of the lift-offs and landings of the planes.



Tourist Information is run by the Okinawa Convention Bureau, where pamphlets on events and shopping are available.
